Nuflor, Draxxin, Excede, etc.

If I was only going to spend money on on “big gun” antibiotic (just starting out), I wouldn’t choose Baytril (legal for pneumonia in cattle only), Micotil (kills goats), or Naxcel or Excenel (require daily dosing)
